#### DCWC Christmas Luncheon (Continued from page 1)

After the singing, Margene invited Archbishop Schnurr to speak to the group. He started by telling us that he grew up in a small town of about 600 people in northeast lowa. Never did he ever expect to be an Archbishop! We found out that his favorite place to visit is Italy. He speaks fluent Italian, loves the culture, food and the country side of the country. Plus, he vacations for one week each year in Florida.

Then, he shared an update on the Diocesan plan: Beacons of Light and the Families of Parishes. The Plan is meant to bring pastoral vitality to the parishes and not meant to close parishes. "The Archdiocese of Cincinnati is entering its third century. I am convinced that Beacons of Light, born of great hope, will enable us to form stronger parishes, centered on the Eucharist, that radiate the love of Christ and joy of the Gospel...

God has abundantly blessed our first two centuries and will certainly bless the next," believes Archbishop Schnurr.

To explain the Plan further, Fr. Jan Schmidt, Director of the Office of Pastoral Vitality, which supports priests, deacons, and lay leaders as they lead their parishes to live and grow in faith, spoke about the changes needed for the Diocese to move forward for the next 100 years. The number of priests has dropped. In 1971, there were 874 priests in the Diocese. Now in 2022, there are only 170 priests. Help is needed to keep the parishes a vibrant with fewer priests and an active laity. Thus, many meetings held throughout the Archdiocese generated information and produced Beacons of Lights, all designed to bring us into the third century.

Mr. Jeremy Helmes, from the Office of Worship and Sacraments, is the Executive Director of the Beacons of Light long-range plan. The plan contains 6 Guiding Principles: Eucharist at the Center, Leadership, Church, Stewardship, Evangelization and Love In Action. To follow these Principles there are 31 parameters that can be found on the Archdiocese of Cincinnati website.

We want to express our gratitude for these three members of the Archdiocese for joining us at our Christmas Luncheon.

After the Beacon of Light presentation, a fabulous lunch was served. During dessert, a special ceremony was held. (Directly following this article, on page 3, see New Honorary Member article).

Following lunch, the excitement of the raffle drawing began! There were almost 50 raffle prizes ranging from cash, gift certificates, wrapped baskets with food, lottery tickets, household items, candy, wine and so much more. The winners beamed when they heard their name called by Lisa Nussman, former President, and a lively, speedy caller. The big drawing of the day was a new event – a 50/50 Drawing. The prize this year was \$495 and was won by Pat Rau. She immediately said Thank you and returned half of the money so that another name could be drawn. The second name was Barb Kreuzer. Both ladies were stunned and excited!

The day ended with prayer. Everyone took home their purchases from the vendor shops, their baked goodies and all the raffle prizes. A good day was had by all. We hope you and your family had a joyful and blessed Christmas!

# New Honorary DCWC Members Celebrated at the Christmas Luncheon by Pat Rau

At the Christmas Luncheon while everyone was enjoying their tiramisu, a surprise ceremony was held. Margene Robinson, President, stepped to the podium, asked for attention

and began telling the good news.

In November 2022, by a unanimous vote by the Board of Directors, two women were chosen to be in the special group of Honorary Members. As it is written in the DCWC Constitution, ARTICLE III, Sec. 2. *This honor shall be conferred only in recognition of exceptional service to this organization or in community or national affairs*.

In the 100-year history of DCWC, only 18 women have received this Award.

On December 3, 2022, Anita Clune Rankin and Ruth Thompson Galyon, both former DCWC Presidents, joined this group and came forward to receive a special plaque.

Anita Clune Rankin was honored for forward thinking when she brought in people from the National Level and community level to work on the parliamentary procedures of the Constitution and meetings. Following in her mother's footsteps, Anita updated the history of DCWC. Anita led the way to begin the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary fund at the Dayton Foundation. She has been an active mentor since she was President in 1990.

Ruth Thompson Galyon was honored for her ability and commitment to personally make contacts in the community ever increasing financial support and participation in every event. Ruth participated actively by making her home available as a staging point for assembling Christmas stockings, building baskets full of clothing, filling purses full of feminine items and candy gathering. She has been an active mentor and leader since she was President in 1998.

Both women gently share their wisdom and advice, believing in DCWC and practicing the Faith; Loving us all. Thank you, Anita and Ruth. You are shepherds and disciples for DCWC.

Also, per the Constitution, the Archbishop of Cincinnati is automatically an Honorary Member. Archbishop Schnurr was given an engraved paper weight signifying this honor.
