Gail's Hails: An excerpt from Angelus, LA Catholics article; *LA Fire captain salvages tabernacle from Corpus Christi rubble* by Ann Rodgers

"Four days after <u>Corpus Christi Church was incinerated</u> in the Palisades fire, Captain Bryan Nassour of the Los Angeles Fire Department picked his way over a six-foot layer of rubble in the ashen bones of the sanctuary and recovered the tabernacle. "I did it because the whole community has been decimated – it looks like a nuclear (continued on page 2)

(continued from page 1) has gone off and nothing is standing," said Nassour, whose family belongs to St. Francis de Sales Church in Sherman Oaks, and whose brother belongs to Corpus Christi. "My brother lost his home. I have close friends who lost everything but the shirts on their backs, and they belong to that church too. So, if I could save just one thing, let it be this, so they have something to believe in.""

Finding God in the midst of our trouble means sometimes we have to look for the blessings in the midst of the storm. Like Captain Nassour, I pray we can find those moments that give us strength to look up and see God is there as He promised. Message of Inspiration – Message Three National Eucharistic Congress – Indianapolis, IN

My Sisters in Christ -

As I wrote in the previous newsletter, I had the privilege to attend this wonderful National Eucharistic Congress. It was an opportunity I'll never forget and felt called to share with you what we took away from our experiences.

This summer, 250,000 people joined for 6,500 miles of the Pilgrimage, from the 4 corners of the US. On Saturday at the National Eucharistic Congress, the Indianapolis Police Department used street cameras to estimate 60,000 processed through downtown. 60,000 passes were distributed for the Congress with an estimated 55,000 folks joining us in Lucas Oil Stadium for a liturgy or session. In the excitement, it was announced that "Jesus is here" and a voice said, "please kneel". We spent 30 minutes, before our Lord.

In the message from Tim Glemkowski on the final night in the stadium, he shared what drove all the planning for the Congress—not just that we were doing something for God, but that He had come for His people. He said "When is an event more than an event? When that is God's plan for it". Please go to this site to see his full speech. May I again remind you, we are encouraged to think of the Eucharist with more reverence and adoration, by attending adoration at your local church as the Lord is always waiting for you to come and visit with Him. It is his way to share his Love to you.

This message was taken from a book "I Wait For You" selected and arranged by The Way of Divine Love of Sister Josefa Menendez. When was the last time you made a visit to Our Lord? Jesus told Sister Menendez: "It is this love that keeps Me a prisoner in the tabernacle. For nearly twenty centuries I have dwelt there, night and day, veiled under the species of Bread and concealed in the small white Host." (p. 41-42); "How often should I wait for this or that other soul to visit Me in the Blessed Sacrament...how many nights should I spend longing for his coming...but he would let business or carelessness or anxiety for his health get the better of him...and he would not come!" (p. 33); "Were you weak or ill in body surely you would find time to see a doctor who would cure you? Come, then, to the One who is able to give both strength and health to your soul, and bestow the alms of love on this Divine Prisoner who watches for you, calls for you and longs to see you at His side." (p.18).

Again, thank you for letting me share more of my story and know that I continue to pray that even though you didn't have the personal experience of attending, you may gain some knowledge and grace from these messages.
