Catholic Social Services of the Miami Valley established Erma's House in 1997 in honor of Dayton author and humorist, Erma Bombeck. It provides *a site for supervised visitation that gives children a chance to interact with their non-custodial parents in a safe, neutral, and monitored environment.*

Visits allow children to maintain relationships with both parents, no matter what the circumstances that divided the family. Families must be referred by a third party such as Montgomery County Children Services, a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA), a guardian-ad-litem (GAL), a mental health professional or social worker, or the family or criminal courts.

Children who come to Erma's House range in age from 0-18 years, but most are 5-9 years. These are children from broken families where it has been determined that the non-custodial parent should not have an unsupervised visit with the child for one reason or another. At least one parent/guardian must live in Montgomery County.

When parents visit with their children at Erma's, they are encouraged to play games, make crafts, and share snacks. Funding is needed to replenish the snack cupboard and replace consumable play items like coloring books, crayons and board games.

Erma's House has long been considered the gold standard in supervised visitation. By providing healthy snacks and fun play opportunities, the center can continue to serve families and children when they need it the most. By enabling interaction between a parent and a child, no matter how and why they have been separated, Erma's House helps heal families and reduces trauma that can impact children later in life.

DCWC awarded one of our charitable grants this spring to EH to replace the air hockey table which is very popular with the older children.

Another critical need is additional **Volunteer Visitation Monitors**. There is always a waiting list of 12-15 families who can't be served due to a shortage of monitors. If interested in volunteering, contact CSSMV, 937-223-7217 or visit [www.cssmv.org](http://www.cssmv.org).
